PEC - G



The Graduate Student Agreement Program (PEC-G), currently governed by DECREE No. 11,923, of FEBRUARY 15, 2024, and INTERMINISTERIAL ORDINANCE MEC/MRE No. 7, of JUNE 4, 2024, is administered by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs through the Educational Cooperation Division (DCE) and by the Ministry of Education through the Higher Education Secretariat (SESU/DIPES/CGRE), in partnership with Higher Education Institutions throughout the country. This Program is developed through a set of cooperation activities and procedures aimed at training and qualifying foreign students between the ages of 18 and 23, who have completed high school and are from developing countries with which Brazil maintains active bilateral agreements. The objectives of this Cooperation are consolidated through the completion, by selected students, of their entire undergraduate studies in Brazil at Higher Education Institutions (IES) participating in PEC-G - federal and state public universities and private ones, and with the return of students to their country of origin. PEC and PEC-PLE refer to modalities of the Student Agreement Program (PEC), a program of the Brazilian government aimed at the training and qualification of international students in higher education institutions in Brazil.



WHAT IS PEC-G?

The PEC-G is a program of the Brazilian government that offers students from developing countries the opportunity to attend undergraduate courses for free in public and private Brazilian universities that participate in the program.

WHO CAN APPLY FOR PEC-G? Foreign students from developing countries that have educational and cultural agreements with Brazil can apply. The

candidate must have completed high school, be between 18 and 23 years old, and demonstrate basic proficiency in Portuguese. WHAT IS THE SELECTION PROCESS FOR PEC-G? The candidate must register at the Embassy or Consulate of Brazil in their country of origin, present the required

documents, and undergo an evaluation process. The selection takes into account academic criteria and program requirements.

HOW DOES THE CHOICE OF UNIVERSITY AND COURSE WORK?

Does the PEC-G cover all the costs for the student? No. The program offers a waiver of tuition fees, but the student must cover their expenses for housing, food, transportation, and academic materials. Some universities provide financial assistance for PEC-G students.

The candidate can indicate courses and universities of their preference in the application, but the final decision on the allocation of the student is up to the Brazilian government and the participating educational institutions.
